



Policy: Hershey Aquatic Club swimmers Facility Code of Conduct

Effective Date: March 6, 2006

The Hershey Parks and Recreation facility is a Derry Township property and is rented by the Hershey Aquatic Club (HAC) for competitive training, practice and meets. HAC is not the exclusive renter of this facility and it is very important that we use this facility with respect to others using it as well as those managing it.

Conduct that is considered inappropriate can and will result in loss of facility privileges and/or loss of membership with the HAC.

Inappropriate conduct includes aggressive behavior, horse play, vandalism or theft of services. Use of the locker room and shower areas should be limited to not more than 15 minutes before practice to change and shower as well as 15 minutes after practice to shower and change.

Behaviors in the lobby and other areas should be of a mature and respectful manner.

If you witness inappropriate activities please report this to the coaching staff immediately.

Prohibited Conduct

- Use of obscene, profane, vulgar, derogatory, demeaning, or threatening language or gestures.
- Spitting or other inappropriate behavior.
- Disregarding facility usage policies and procedures including signage.
- Using a false I.D. or another person's I.D. for admission to the building.
- Entering the facility by means other than proper check-in procedures.
- Verbal abuse of patrons, staff members or others.
- Damage to University equipment (whether restitution is made may mitigate the severity of the sanction imposed).
- Violent, assaultive and/or physical behavior directed toward patrons, staff members or others.
- Threats, verbal or otherwise, directed at patrons, staff members or others.
- Theft of personal property.
- Theft of University equipment or services.
- Sexual misconduct; including, but not limited to exhibitionistic and obscene behavior.
- Violation of Recreation Center policies or procedures.
- Violation of local, state or federal regulations or laws
